

IntraNexus booth fit for New Orleans

NEW ORLEANS - When the staff at IntraNexus folds up the booth at the end of HIMSS07, the furniture won't be going back to headquarters with them. Instead, the contents will be donated to the St. Bernard Project (www.stbernardproject.org), formed to help New Orleans residents whose homes were damaged in Hurricane Katrina. At the close of HIMSS07 on Thursday, Alexis Exhibits will deliver approximately \$2,000 in furnishings to the foundation's local offices, including a leather couch and club chair ensemble, a coffee table, end table and eight bar stools.

CDW Corp., also an exhibitor, announced the donation of mission-critical IT, infrastructure solutions and services to Carolinas Medical Center's MED-1, a one-of-a-kind mobile treatment facility that provides comprehensive on-site medical care in response to disasters and mass casualties. The newly upgraded facility, which consists of two 53-foot tractor trailers, one of which expands to more than 1,000 square feet of treatment space with 134 beds, was unveiled here at HIMSS07. The solution includes Voice over IP networking hardware and phones, a positive patient ID tracking system, picture archiving and communications systems infrastructure technology.
